Today more Nations are pursuing private investments in wholly-owned companies, both on and off Reserves.

Chief Louie's efforts have been widely recognized in Canada and the United States. In 1999, he received the Aboriginal Business Leader Award from All Nations Trust and Development Corporation. In 2000, the Advancement of Native Development Officers (CANDO) named Chief Louie the "Economic Developer of the Year".

In the same year, Clarence was chosen to join the Governor General of Canada in the 2000 leadership tour. In 2001, Chief Louie was appointed to the Aboriginal Business Canada Board and most recently was appointed Chairperson of this Board. In 2002, Aboriginal Tourism B.C. awarded Chief Louie the "Inspirational Leadership Award". MacLean's Magazine listed Chief Clarence Louie as one of the "Top 50 Canadians to Watch" in their January 2003 issue. More

recognition came in 2003 as the U.S.

Department of State selected Clarence as
1 of 6 First Nation representatives to
participate in a 2-week tour of successful
American Indian tribes. In April 2004, the
National Aboriginal Achievement
Foundation presented Clarence with the
award for "Business and Community
Development".

The National Aboriginal Achievement Awards represent the highest honor the Aboriginal Community bestows upon its own achievers. In June 2006, Chief Louie was presented with the Order of British Columbia, which is the province's highest honor for outstanding achievement.

Chief Louie was awarded the Order of Canada in 2016 and became the first Aboriginal person to be inducted into the Canadian Business Hall of Fame in 2018.



ATCO Frontec - Beyond Transactions: Redefining Business Partnerships with Indigenous Communities

Join Yannick Bedard and Angela MacKinnon, from ATCO Frontec, for a thought-provoking session on building meaningful, accountable, and transparent business partnerships with Indigenous communities, economic development branches, entrepreneurs, and more. This presentation will explore the evolving role of corporations in fostering true reconciliation through sustainable economic engagement.

Key themes include understanding respectful business practices, avoiding the pitfalls of "selling dreams" or symbolic partnerships, and embracing transparency and accountability as essential business values. 

Stolo Syelt Xesxel (Fraser River Debris Trap) - A first of its kind agreement was struck between the province of BC and Shxw'owhámél First Nation, creating the Fraser River Debris Trap. Located between Hope and Agassiz, it reduces the volume of woody material flowing into the lower reaches of the Fraser River and Salish Sea, catching as much as 100,000 cubic metres of woody debris, or around 2,000 logging trucks worth. We are exploring potential uses for the wood debris collected, such as converting it to bioenergy, and other uses such as selling salvageable timber to forest companies for processing.


