The revenue model from the sign companies to Nations hasn't changed much in the last decade and is far less than what can be achieved with the latest generation of digital billboard technology.

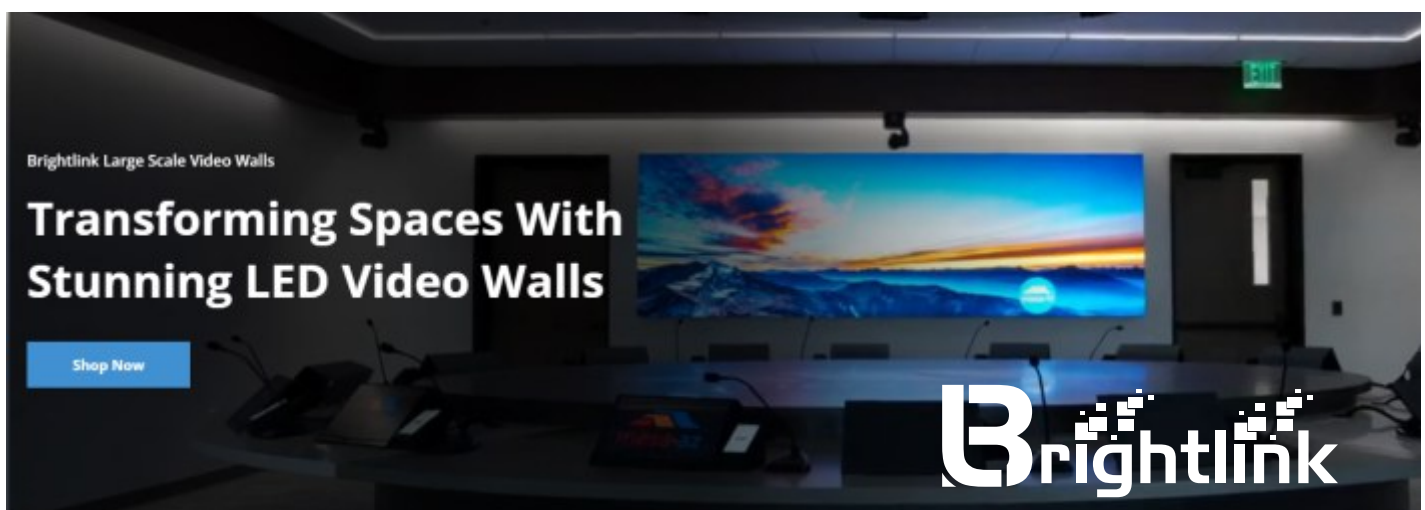
In this presentation Anton will showcase the latest technology now available for digital billboards and give revenue examples of how much these billboards can generate for communities.

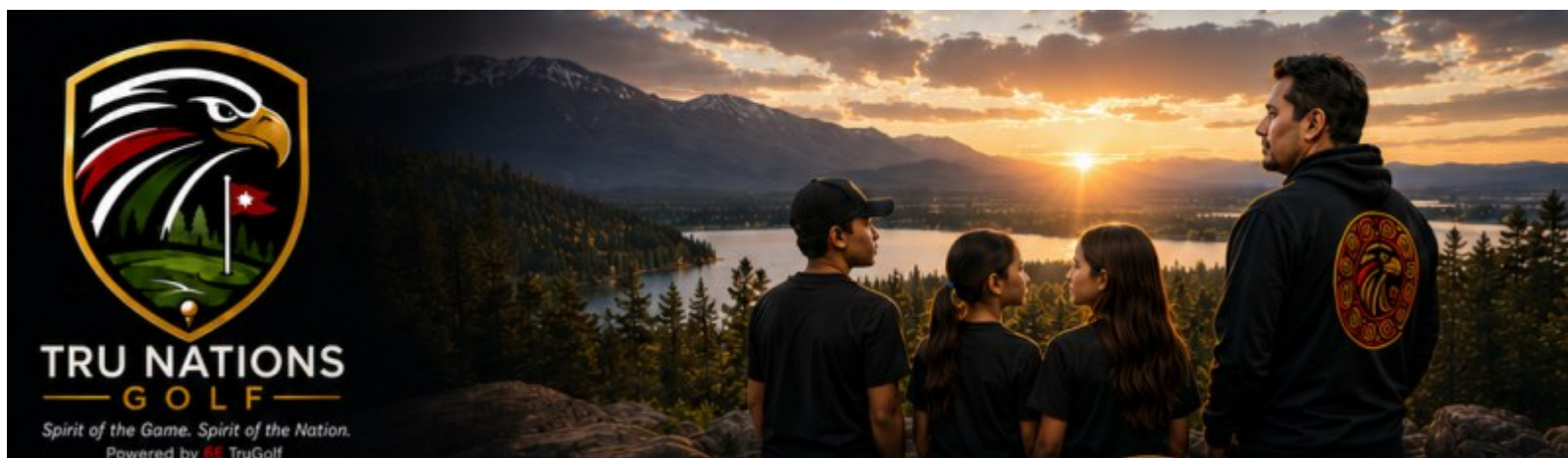

Preserving Capital to Creating Possibility

Indigenous Nations and development corporations are managing more capital than at any point in history. For many, the first priority has understandably been preservation. The question now is how to move from preserving capital to creating possibilities. This session begins with a different question: what does your Nation need this capital to do? From there, Cary Pinkowski covers why money needed next year should be managed differently from money meant to last generations, and why a missed opportunity — a better rate, a manager never considered, an investment never seen — never appears on any statement.

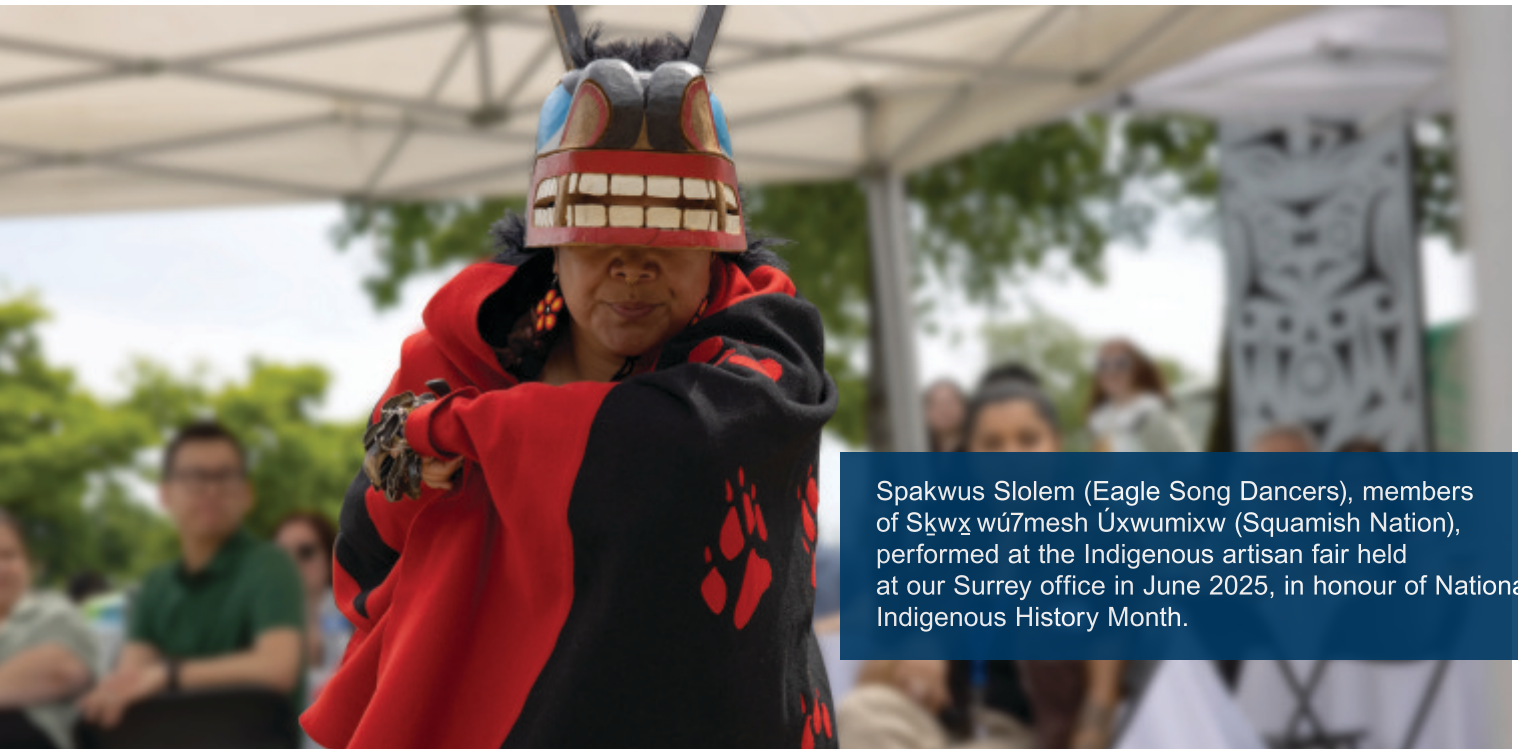

Keynote Luncheon Speaker - Chief Clarence Louie



**CHIEF

CEO, Osoyoos Indian Band

Chief Louie's efforts have been widely recognized in Canada and the United States. In 1999, he received the Aboriginal Business Leader Award from All Nations Trust and Development Corporation. In 2000, the Advancement of Native Development Officers (CANDO) named Chief Louie the *"Economic Developer of the Year"*.

In the same year, Clarence was chosen to join the Governor General of Canada in the 2000 leadership tour. In 2001, Chief Louie was appointed to the Aboriginal Business Canada Board and most recently was appointed Chairperson of this Board. In 2002, Aboriginal Tourism B.C. awarded Chief Louie the "Inspirational Leadership Award". MacLean's Magazine listed Chief Clarence Louie as one of the *"Top 50 Canadians to Watch"* in their January 2003 issue. More recognition came in 2003 as the U.S. Department of State selected Clarence as 1 of 6 First Nation representatives to participate in a 2-week tour of successful

American Indian tribes. In April 2004, the National Aboriginal Achievement Foundation presented Clarence with the award for "Business and Community Development".

The National Aboriginal Achievement Awards represent the highest honor the Aboriginal Community bestows upon its own achievers. In June 2006, Chief Louie was presented with the Order of British Columbia, which is the province's highest honor for outstanding achievement.

Chief Louie was awarded the Order of Canada in 2016 and became the first Aboriginal person to be inducted into the Canadian Business Hall of Fame in 2018.

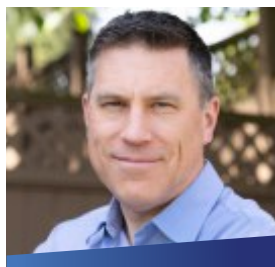

Building Indigenous Food Security and Economic Growth Through Modular Land-Based Aquaculture

Many First Nations are seeking sustainable economic development opportunities that align with community values, create lasting employment, and support economic diversification. In this context, land-based aquaculture presents a promising solution. Most land-based aquaculture developments are large scale operations requiring significant capital investment, extensive infrastructure, and highly customized engineering. This presentation introduces a different approach: standardized, modular land-based aquaculture systems that provide a practical and scalable pathway into commercial seafood production. Built around proven recirculating aquaculture technology, these systems deliver year-round production in a controlled biosecure environment while requiring very little water, relatively low power, and a compact land footprint, making them suitable for a broad range of locations and community development strategies.

Drawing on decades of global aquaculture experience, PR Aqua has developed a repeatable platform designed to support Indigenous economic development, food sovereignty, and long-term community ownership. The session will explore how modular aquaculture can create local employment, strengthen regional supply chains, generate opportunities for value-added processing and waste-to-value businesses, and provide a foundation for future expansion. Attendees will gain insight into how standardized infrastructure can reduce project risk, improve cost predictability, and create an investable pathway toward sustainable seafood production and resilient community economies.

Carbon Fund – Canada: Launching an Indigenous-Owned Franchise in Global Carbon Finance

Marc Tison is the founder of The Carbon Fund and architect of the [Platinum Programme™](#) — a compliance-grade, end-to-end carbon crediting platform that turns climate action into lasting capital for communities.

Over the past four years Marc has built The Carbon Fund into a vertically integrated platform managing the full carbon project lifecycle — from origination through verification, issuance, and sale. The organisation has onboarded hundreds of projects with a pipeline exceeding 2 billion compliance-grade credits. Its model removes traditional barriers: 1) project owners face zero upfront development costs, and 2) buyers receive cashback warranties if they are unable to retire their credits through the Platinum Programme™. Ten percent of every credit sold is committed to grassroots SDG impact. No other global carbon market programme both manages the entire project life cycle and permanently ring-fences capital for community benefit in this way.

In Africa, Marc has worked closely with Indigenous communities across several countries. He has earned the respect of traditional leaders not only for the technical and financial quality of his inputs, but for the spirit in which the work is done — listening first, honouring the land, respecting leaders and community, and ensuring that ownership and benefit flow back to the people who have always been the land's true stewards. That same spirit has taken him to Canada.

Marc is bringing this proven model north through the launch of Carbon Fund – Canada, an Indigenous-owned franchise developed in genuine partnership with First Nations. Ten percent of the franchise's operating income is permanently ring-fenced for SDG-aligned community projects, returning capital directly to First Nations across the country. The goal is straightforward and shared: climate finance that strengthens Indigenous ownership, builds intergenerational wealth, and honours the sacred responsibility for all to care for the land.

**With or Without You:
Is litigation replacing the Treaty table?**

Court recognized Aboriginal title in an urban area and found it can co-exist with fee simple on the same parcel. In *Wolastoqey*, the New Brunswick Court of Appeal took the opposite view, calling those interests “irreconcilable.” Meanwhile, in *Nuchatlaht*, the BC Court of Appeal declared Aboriginal title over 201 square kilometres, an area nearly eighteen times that declared at trial, after a fraction of the court time seen in comparable cases.

If Aboriginal title can now be established more quickly and over broader areas through litigation, is the treaty process losing its central role? The pattern suggests the judiciary may be increasingly

inclined to bring finality, not prolong it, with Aboriginal title never seeming more attainable or certain as a legal outcome, the question is no longer whether reconciliation will occur, but how, and on whose timeline. It may be productive to redirect energy and efforts to messaging grounded on practical reassurance and resolution: reaching interim and long-term agreements fairly and expeditiously while devising mechanisms designed to provide private landowners and mortgage lenders with confidence their interests are secure.

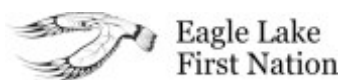

Another primary objective is the management of ʔaḥuusʔaḥ's OSR (Own Source Revenue), which minimizes the effect of the Government of Canada's policy responsible for reducing the amount paid by the government to Indigenous Nations for their programs and services.

Maaqutusiis Hahoulthee Stewardship Society is responsible for managing economic development – comprising all of the resources within the haḥuutii – for the benefit of the ʔaḥuusʔaḥ musčim. We commit to doing this in a manner that is open, transparent, equitable and accountable to all ʔaḥuusʔaḥ, while also holding true to our guiding principles as ʔaḥuusʔaḥ: lisʔa staḥ (respecting one another), Haaḥuupstaḥ (teaching one another), Yaʔakstaḥ (caring for one another), and Huupiiʔaḥ (helping one another).
